SNAP Cymru offer impartial information and advice for families and children/ young people with ALN (aged 0-25) We provide the support you need to make informed decisions and play an active role in your child's education.

We explain ALN processes and procedure in straight-forward language so you know what to expect and what part you can play. Our aim is to empower and support you to work in partnership with schools and the local authority to ensure that children's needs are met.

What we do

- Listen to your questions and concerns
- Provide clear and reliable information about ALN in early years, schools and post-16 institutions
- Offer support with ALN processes and ALN law
- Provide support to prepare for meetings (sometimes we can attend with you)
- Support you through the IDP process
- Support you to complete relevant paperwork, understand reports and letters
- Work with you to explore your options
- Signpost you to other services, including support groups
- Help you to avoid and resolve disagreements
- We often work with children and their parents together, but also offer a direct and separate service to young people



Most ALN concerns can be resolved informally by talking to your child's early years setting, school or the college. Being involved and getting help early can make a real difference to your child's progress.

However if you need extra help, SNAP Cymru can give you clear and straightforward information about your options so you can

- confidently share your views, make informed decisions
- understand your situation and take whatever action you need
- help you to resolve issues and find solutions
- provide advice and support if you can't agree
